<p><u>Vocabulary & Explanation</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Promenade- A path you can walk on that is next to the sea.  • Amusements/Entertainment- Activities you can do that are fun and make you feel happy. • Pier- A large platform that sticks out into the sea, that people can walk on or boats can stop at.  • Souvenir- something you keep as a reminder of a person, place or event. • Bathing machine- A little wooden hut where people can get changed into their swimwear.  • Punch and Judy- A funny puppet show that was popular on Victorian beaches  • Victorian times- Victorian times were when Queen Victoria was queen of England.
