Sticky knowledge:

A sculpture is where plastic or hard materials, like wood, stone, or metal, are shaped into 3D objects.

A Sculptor is the name given to the type of artist who makes sculptures.

Sculptors use light, shape and colour to create interesting effects.

Some sculptures are kinetic. This means they can move.



Key Vocabulary

Mannequin- a dummy of the human body. They can be found in shops displaying clothes.

Wooden mannequins can be used by artists to help with their drawings and sculptures.



Mobile- It usually hangs from the ceiling and can turn around in the air.

Glass maker- Some sculptors make the glass and decorate and shape the glass to make a sculpture.
