## What are portraits?

- A portrait is a painting/picture of a person, this can be painted by the artist themselves (self-portrait) or by someone else.
- A portrait can be created in any art medium e.g. paint, chalk, collage etc.

## Pablo Picasso

- Pablo Ruiz Picasso (25 October 1881 – 8 April 1973) was a Spanish painter, sculptor, printmaker, ceramicist and theatre designer.
- He spent most of his adult life in France.
- One of the most influential artists of the 20th century, he is known for co-founding the Cubist movement and other important styles.
- Among his most famous works are Les Femmes d'Alger (O.J. 1965), and Guernica (1937).

## Key Vocabulary

**Subject:** the thing or person being painted

**Cubism:** a style of art that uses abstract shapes to represent different parts of a subject.

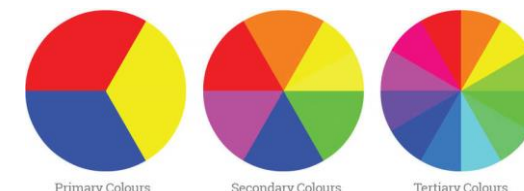
**Tint:** different colour produced when added white to a colour.

**Tone:** different colour produced when black is added to the colour.

**Facial Features** are a person's eyes, nose ears and mouth. -



**Tertiary colours** are formed when you mix primary colours and secondary colours together.



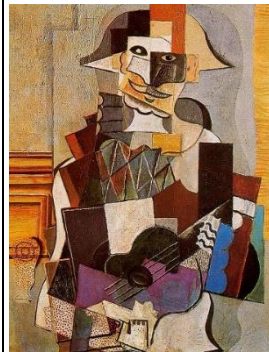
