Generic skills	Develops children's knowledge of grapheme-phoneme correspondences (GPC's). Develops the skills of segmenting and blending. Recognition of high frequency words. Teaches and practices the skills of blending separate sounds together into whole words to read. Develops segmenting skills for spelling.	Develops children's knowledge of GPCs, their skills of blending and segmenting with letters and recognition of high frequency words containing GPCs not taught at that phase. Teaches and practises the skills of blending and segmenting sounds represented by single letters and graphemes of more than one letter.	Develops children's knowledge of GPCs, their skills of blending and segmenting with letters and recognition of high frequency words containing GPCs not taught at that phase. There are no new GPCs to be learnt in this phase. Develops children's knowledge and skills of blending and segmenting words with adjacent consonants. Children learn more graphemes for the 40+ phonemes taught in Phases Two and Three and more ways of pronouncing graphemes introduced in Phases Two and Three. Teaches and practices the skills of blending and segmenting using all GPCs taught.
