### Changes to school routines

#### Plimsolls

From 4<sup>th</sup> January 2018 we would ask that children no longer wear plimsolls during the school day. Wearing plimsolls provides limited support for arches and, following medical advice, we have made the decision that children should wear normal school shoes throughout the day. We will send home plimsolls on Tuesday 18<sup>th</sup> December.

#### Morning routine

Please be aware that prior to the school day, children are under parental responsibility. We ask that when children enter the playground they line up and do not run around/use the play equipment. When the first whistle is blown parents may leave; when the second whistle is blown teachers will walk the children to their classes. In an effort to ease the congestion next to Year R, from 4<sup>th</sup> January KS2 children will walk to their classrooms via the main entrance rather than through the red gate. The children will practice this on the last day of term in preparation for next term.

Please be aware that if you drop your child off and their line has already gone, the child must be signed in at the school office. This is a safeguarding issue and no exceptions will be made.
