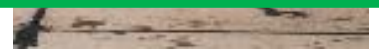

Anyone who had a family member who fought in any war were welcome to bring in a photo to put on a poppy as we prayed for all whose lives had been taken.

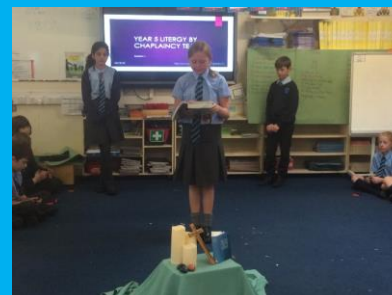

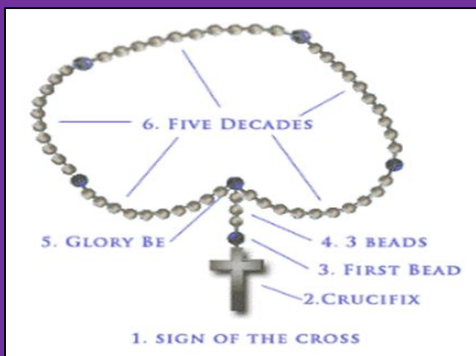
Rosaries
