At this time we would like to recognize and thank those Governors who left this term, all had been Governors for some years and their contributions have always been appreciated in working collectively together for the benefit of the school and its pupils.

Positive feedback

At the end of a successful year, the Governors would like to acknowledge the hard work and dedication of Mrs Nicholson and all staff. The progress the school has made within the past calendar year has been seen first-hand through our frequent school visits and the children are thriving. Despite the fact that this is not reflected in the league tables yet, in 2019 we were measured against an unreliable baseline from KS1 data from years ago, we are sure that next year and the year after we will see the trend move upward in line with more accurate baseline data.

We have also had a number of external visitors to the school reporting on all aspects of school life, the quality of teaching and pupil development. Their reports, which Mrs Nicholson has referred to in her newsletters throughout the year, have without exception validated the current, accurate judgements around data and the school continues to shine in every visit.

Notable comments include:

"Attainment and progress across the school is high. The school has created a supportive, inclusive environment where all staff and pupils show determination to move forward. The leadership creates a relentless drive for improvement and ultimate success."

"Early Years Foundation Stage data represents a strong profile with improved attainment levels on 2018 data – 83% of children reach a good level of development and this is above national and Herts averages. The phonics screening check scores for pupils at end of year 1 are high (90%) and are also above Herts and national averages"

In looking at the work of our pupils, the progress achieved for most is good, however the data does not look strong due to the inaccurate high standards recorded at the end of KS1 four years ago. Please be assured that the entire Governing Body closely scrutinise all progress reports and data and welcome qualified external visitors at any time to do the same.
