## Snack time!


- All children are offered a snack after playtime (10:45am).


### **Weekly Spellings**



### Books this this term...

We will begin with stories with predictable phrasing and pattern:

- We're Going on a Bear Hunt by Michael Rosen.
- I Want my Hat Back! By Jon Klassen.
- Farmer Duck by Martin Waddell.
- Poetry books focusing on rhyme and the 5 senses.
- We will also be including drama in our lessons, writing character descriptions and letters.





The children will choose a book from our school library weekly.

Reading a wide range of different genres of books is very important: stories, poems, non-fiction, comics and magazines.

# Maths – How you can help at home? By practising:

Number bonds to 10.

Rapid Mental Recall – Knowing simple subtraction and addition facts off by heart.

To be able to count in 2s, 5,s and 10's.



Cooking or baking together at home.

Weighing ingredients using scales.

Setting the table – how many forks do we need? etc

Read and tell the time using analogue and digital clocks.

Work with money and calculate their change.





#### **Curriculum Map**

#### **English**

Labels, lists and captions- labelling our classroom resources, writing shopping lists and adding captions to images.

Stories with predictable phrasing- We're Going on a Bear Hunt, I Want My Hat Back, Farmer Duck.

Poetry- The senses, rhyming words.

Letter Writing- The Jolly Postman, Letter to Santa.

Handwriting: We will be focusing on correct letter formation.

#### **Phonics**

We follow the Little Wandle phonics and reading scheme. Children receive daily phonics lessons and separate reading practise. We are starting the autumn term reviewing phase 3 and phase 4 phonics before moving onto Phase 5.

#### Geography

Where do I live?

Children will find out where the United Kingdom is located on a world map and explore the features of the countries and capital cities of the UK. They will also find out more about their local area, Hitchin.

#### History

#### Toys

We will explore the history of Toys, by thinking about and discussing their favourite toys and then going on to look at what toys were like in the past and how they are different to toys today.

#### Computing

Online Safety- Logging in safely, knowing how to keep safe online, exploring features of <u>Purple</u> mash that is used for our computing lessons.

Pictograms- showing data they have collected through pictures.

#### **Mathematics**

Numbers to ten- Finding patterns in numbers, using comparisons (more than, less than, fewer), regrouping the whole and solving problems using part of whole unknown.

Numbers to twenty- Making 10 and some more, estimating and ordering, doubling and halving, identifying odd and even numbers.

**Geometry-** positional language, ordinal numbers (1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>), Naming and identifying some properties of 2D and 3D shapes.

#### Science

Using our Senses- Children will build on their understanding of human body. They are introduced to the concept of five senses that help them to find out about the world around them.

Everyday Materials- introduces children to a range of basic materials and their properties. They understand that materials can be made into certain products.

#### Art

#### Andy Goldsworthy

Children will think about the colours, materials and shapes Goldsworthy uses in his artwork. They will examine several of his sculptures and use them as inspiration for their own creations!

#### Design & Technology

Structures - Homes

Children will design, make and evaluate their own model houses made from cardboard.




### What is RSE?

- RSE stands for "relationships and sex education" and as part of Relationships and Health Education, is a new approach to teaching children about relationships and health. This is compulsory in all primary schools.
- All primary school children will be required to learn about relationships and health. The programme includes teaching about personal health, physical and emotional well-being, strong emotions, private parts of the body, personal relationships, family structures, trusted adults, the dangers of social media, all age appropriate and is sensitive to the needs and religious backgrounds of the children in the school.
- We will begin our RSE lessons after the half term break and we will let you know what we are teaching each week. Please see the TEN TEN parent portal for information.
