Phonics

We follow the Little
Wandle phonics and reading
scheme. Children receive
daily phonics lessons and
separate reading practise.
We are currently learning
Phase 5 phonic sounds.

Design Technology Food Technology

The children will be learning about different fruits and vegetable and creating their own delicious smoothies.

Computing

Lego Builders- Using Purple Mash, children will be introduced to the term 'algorithm'. This concept is at the core of coding.

Maze Explorers- This builds upon the previous unit, linking logical thought processes to the way that computers are programmed.

Geography

Four Seasons

Children will find out which months of the year belong to which season, as well as what the weather is like in spring, summer, autumn and winter, and what this means for animals, people and the landscape.

Art

Colour Creations Artist focus = Wassily Kandindsky.

Children will learn about primary and secondary colours and will experiment with adding white (tint) or black (shade) to make different colours.

History

Intrepid explorers

Find out about Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong, investigating why they are remembered today, what they achieved and how they are similar to or different from each other.

Maths

Place Value within 50– Count forwards and backwards, beginning with zero or from any given number. Represent numbers using objects and pictorial representations including the number line.

Addition and Subtraction (within 20) - Add and subtract 1-digit and 2-digit numbers to 20, including zero

Measures - Compare, describe and solve practical problems for: lengths and height; mass/weight; capacity and volume; time

Science

Weather - Seasonal Change

Children will observe the effects that changing seasons and weather have on them and on the world around them.

Looking at Animals

Children will learn about a variety of familiar and less familiar animals, including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals. They will identify and name, look closely at and compare and contrast many different animals from the UK.

PSHE and **RSE**

In PSHE we will focus on **Health and Wellbeing**: being healthy; hygiene; medicines; people who help us with health. We will also look at **Living in the wider world**: money; making choices; needs and wants.

We are following the TenTen programme for our weekly RSE lessons. You can use the parent portal to find our weekly focus. Topics include: Feelings, Special people to us, how we treat others and saying sorry.
